## Dr. Markus Baldinger (Pöttinger) elected new Chairman of CEMA's Technical Board

Markus Baldinger has been Vice President Research & Development at the Austrian-based agricultural technology company Pöttinger since 2010. In August 2016, he was appointed Chief Technical Officer and member of the company's Executive Board.
